¹"RP" refers to campus residential property such as residence halls and other housing for students owned by the University. The 1998 legislation requires that incidents occurring in residential property on campus be reported separately from other campus incidents. "Other" refers to crimes occurring on property owned or controlled by the University other than residential property.

²Non-Campus Building or Property includes student organization property, Lake Okoboji Lakeside Laboratory, Des Moines Higher Education Collaborative Campus, Lake MacBride Field Campus, and the UI Oakdale Campus.

³Public Property includes property immediately adjacent to and accessible from the campus such as thoroughfares, streets, sidewalks, and parking facilities.

⁴Includes Non-Negligent Manslaughter as well as Murder.

⁵The figures for arrests include all drug, liquor law, and weapons charges filed in court, and do not represent the number of individuals arrested.

⁶Disciplinary Referrals are non-arrest disciplinary complaints initiated against students who committed misconduct that constituted a liquor law, drug, or weapon crime.

NOTE: These crime statistics in Table E are derived from crime reports received by the respective law enforcement agencies and administrative departments at the University; they do **not** include privileged counseling information known to the University Counseling Center or the Rape Victim Advocacy Program (R.V.A.P.). RVAP maintains comprehensive statistics on sexual assaults in the greater Iowa City area, including cases where victims have chosen not to report to law enforcement authorities.
